Course Profile	<p>The Flute Academic Course allows young musicians to obtain the II level Academic Diploma of Higher Artistic and Musical Training (AFAM), equivalent to a specialised university degree.</p> <p>The study plan is structured in order to prepare young musicians for the acquisition of a mature artistic awareness, the specialist skills relating to the various performance practices and the history of interpretation will be developed, in order to provide all the elements necessary to achieve a personal and coherent interpretation, through the careful preparation of representative works of the instrumental repertoire. The ability to interact within musical groups will be developed in the practice of ensemble music, a subject of specific in-depth studies.</p> <p>Theoretical teachings of history and analysis of compositional forms and repertoires, musical semiography and cultural marketing complete the training skills offered by the course.</p> <p>The training course takes advantage of the opportunity to participate in the Erasmus+ program, carrying out some study periods abroad.</p> <p>Numerous performance opportunities in fact allow the students of the higher courses to "test" their preparation in the course of public concerts, participation in which is considered an integral part of the course.</p>
