Course Profile	The Bassoon academic course is the training path that allows young musicians to achieve the 1st level Academic Diploma of Higher Artistic and Musical Training (AFAM), equivalent to a three-year university degree.
	The study plan is structured in order to prepare young musicians for the acquisition of a mature artistic awareness, including knowledge of historical evolution and compositional and analytical models of musical language, as well as adequate postural and emotional control techniques.
	The training course takes advantage of the opportunity to participate in the <a href="Erasmus+">Erasmus+</a> program, carrying out some study periods abroad.
	During the three-year period, bassoon players progressively acquire higher-level skills, successfully tackling the most representative repertoire of the instrument, both in the solo field and in ensemble practice and in chamber groups, for wind only and in various combinations.
	Numerous performance opportunities in fact allow the students of the higher courses to "test" their preparation in the course of public concerts, participation in which is considered an integral part of the course.
