Course Profile	The Clarinet Academic Course is a training path which allows young musicians to achieve the 1st level Academic Diploma of Higher Artistic and Musical Training (AFAM), equivalent to a three-year university degree. The study plan is structured in order to prepare young musicians to acquire mature artistic awareness, including knowledge of historical evolution, plus compositional and analytical models of musical language, as well as adequate postural and emotional control techniques. The training course takes advantage of the opportunity to participate in the Erasmus+ program, carrying out some study periods abroad. During the three-year period, the student progressively acquires higher-level skills, successfully facing the most representative repertoire of the instruments that make up the clarinet family, both in the solo field and in ensemble practice and in chamber groups, for wind ensembles and in other combinations. Numerous performance opportunities allow the students of the higher courses to "test" their preparation in public concerts, participation in which is considered an integral part of the course.
