Course Profile	The academic harp degree allows young musicians to obtain the 1st level Academic Diploma of Higher Education in Art and Music (AFAM), equivalent to a three-year university degree. The curriculum is structured in order to prepare a young musician to acquire mature artistic knowledge, including knowledge of the historical evolution of the instrument and compositional and analytical models of the musical language, including appropriate emotional and postural control techniques . The training course takes advantage of the opportunity to participate in the Erasmus+ program, carrying out some study periods abroad. Numerous performance opportunities allow students of higher courses to "test" their preparation during public concerts, participation in which is considered an integral part of the course.
